

DEAR FRIENDS OF THE LOFT CINEMA,

The best way I can come up with to describe The Loft Cinema in 2019-2020 is a rollercoaster ride, and I've never been a big fan of rollercoasters.



2019 was a mini-rollercoaster. Box office in the first quarter was really strong, with unexpected drop for a few months it turned around to end the year with a record box office. We thought that was a wild ride. In 2020, we had our best January and February ever at the box office, and then March and, the rest, is history. And historic.

We are producing a two year "Annual" report because about the time we were ready to prepare the report for 2019, the world changed.

COVID 19 wreaked havoc on the world, and The Loft Cinema closed its doors for the first time ever on March 15. Little did we know then, nor could we have imagined, we would be closed for a year and counting.

It illuminates the generosity of our community, and yes, it ends with a cliff-hanger. We pledge to do everything in our power to make sure that when 2021 draws to a close, this story has a happy ending.

OUR STORY

In 2022, The Loft Cinema will celebrate 50 years of providing art films to audiences in Tucson and Southern Arizona. The path from 1972 to today has been full of changes and challenges, none more difficult than the closure in March 2020 because of the coronavirus pandemic.

The Loft's path forward is not yet completely in focus. What we know for certain is that everyone involved with The Loft Cinema will work together to bring us back to our original purpose of showing films to live audiences on the big screen. This includes our employees, our Board of Directors, our volunteers, our members, our donors, and our audiences.

We don't know what the "new normal" will look like for The Loft Cinema. It is our intention to return to screening the best new independent films from the US and around the world from an inclusive and diverse group of filmmakers. We will return to our signature events including filmmaker visits, First Friday Shorts, Mondo Monday, Cult Classics, sing-a-longs. Our two film festivals, The Loft Film Fest and the Loft Kids Fest, will return! Our solar cinema will once again hit the road taking free films to urban neighborhoods and rural communities. Our partnerships and collaborations with more than 140 local nonprofits will resume to help raise funds and awareness of issues and stories that matter!

The Loft Cinema is a member-supported cinema, with more than 5,000 memberships and 7,000 individual members. Since 2002,

when The Loft Cinema was transitioned to a 501(c)(3) nonprofit arts organization, admissions have more than quadrupled, with record attendance in 2019 of 231,757.

The Loft Cinema is a member of the Sundance Art House Project, based on our excellence of programming and service to our community. The Loft was selected to be an official satellite venue of the Sundance Film Festival in 2021.

Tucson is one of the smaller cities in the US with an independent, nonprofit mission-driven art house. While we collaborate and communicate with our colleagues from peer cinemas, The Loft Cinema is unique and reflects the community of Tucson and Southern Arizona with programming uniquely curated to meet the needs and interests of the many communities of interest that we serve.

The Loft Cinema was voted Best of Tucson by readers of the Tucson Weekly in 2020, after having earned that distinction every year from 2003-2016, and again in 2020!



WHAT WE DO

The Loft Cinema has developed a comprehensive array of programs and activities designed to serve the entire community. During the COVID-19 close, starting March 15, 2020, most of these programs were suspended. All are expected to return, gradually, starting in 2021.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

The Loft Cinema collaborates with dozens of nonprofits and other organizations on screenings and events that allow the groups to promote the understanding of specific issues and to raise funds and awareness.

ESSENTIAL CINEMA

A free series of the most iconic classic art films.

FIRST FRIDAY SHORTS

A monthly competition for local filmmakers to win \$200 and qualify for the finale in May, when the winners of all 12 months compete for \$1,000.

FIRST-RUN FILMS

The best new independent, foreign and documentary films, most in exclusive Tucson engagements.

GUEST FILMMAKERS

Industry professionals, including directors, producers, actors, and writers, interact with audiences and answer questions about the context and artistic content of their work.

JOURNALISM ON SCREEN

An ongoing series pairing films that explore the world of journalism with lively discussions with experts and industry professionals. Presented by The New York Times, the UA School of Journalism, the UA College of Social and Behavioral Sciences and the Arizona Inn.

LATE NIGHT CULT CLASSICS

The greatest cult classics of all time on the big screen.

LOCAL FILM PREMIERES

The Loft Cinema is the venue for premieres of films made in and around Tucson, or by Tucson-based filmmakers, often with the director, writer, producers, cast and crew in attendance.

LOFT KIDS FEST & LOFT JR.

A year-round celebration of family-friendly films with an emphasis on underserved families, featuring an interactive program, hands-on activities, free admission and free popcorn (see page 16 for more details).

LOFT FILM FEST

The Loft Cinema's annual international film festival, presented by Desert Diamond Casinos & Entertainment and National Endowment for the Arts (see page 14 for more details).

LOFT MEMBER SCREENINGS

Loft Cinema members are invited to attend one FREE screening per month on opening night of a new film. Screenings are open to the public at regular admission prices.

MONDO MONDAYS

A series of weird, wild and wonderful films from the Mondo side of the silver screen, every Monday night.

WHAT WE DO CONTINUED

OPEN AIR CINEMA

Launched in September, 2020, and located on The Loft Cinema campus, Open Air Cinema is an outdoor screening space equipped with state-of-the-art DCP projection and FM broadcast sound that offers a wide-range of first-run, classic and special event programming, presented under the stars for a uniquely "Loft" experience.

SCIENCE ON SCREEN

Thought-provoking films, paired with insightful contextual discussions with scientists to create illuminating and entertaining programming that brings the exciting world of science to life on the big screen. Made possible by a grant from the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation and the Coolidge Corner Theatre Foundation.

SHORTS PROGRAMS

The Loft Cinema gives audiences the rare opportunity to enjoy internationally-acclaimed short films on the big screen with annual screenings of nationally-touring shorts programs including the Oscar Nominated Short Films (Animated, Live Action and Documentary), the Sundance Film Festival Short Film Tour, the Manhattan Short Film Festival and Lunafest.

SING-A-LONGS

The most beloved movie musicals of all time come to life at uniquely interactive events where the audience is the star! Onscreen lyrics bring all the songs to life, while prop-filled goodie bags, costume contests and other surprises help bring in the fun! Signature Loft Cinema Sing-A-Longs like *Grease, Purple Rain* and *The Very Merry Holiday Sing-A-Long Spectacular* have become annual Tucson traditions!

SOLAR CINEMA

Loft Solar Cinema is a cargo van outfitted with solar panels provided by our friends at Technicians for Sustainability. With the power of solar energy, Loft Solar Cinema projects films on a 20-foot inflatable screen using a state-of-the-art projector and sound system creating unique viewing experiences in underserved rural and urban areas, while indirectly promoting the value of sustainable energy. THEATER RENTALS

Miss seeing movies on the big screen? We miss showing them to you! We are now renting the theatre to groups of up to 20 people!

THE ALL-NITE SCREAM-O-RAMA

A 12 hour scream-errific cinematic slaughterhouse! Thrills and chills await audience members throughout the night with horror classics that are so scandalously shocking, the only way to stay alive is to keep repeating – "it's only a movie, it's only a movie, it's only movie …"

THE ROCKY HORROR PICTURE SHOW

The Loft Cinema has screened this cult phenomenon Saturdays at Midnight since 1977.

THE SCI-FI SLUMBER PARTY

Sci-fi fans can buckle up for 12 straight hours of intergalactic excitement at the Sci-Fi Slumber Party!, a non-stop excursion into the outer limits of space age cinema, featuring more aliens, robots and apocalyptic insanity than you can shake a light saber at.

VIRTUAL SCREENINGS

During the pandemic, The Loft Cinema started offering first run and classic films to stream at home.



LOFT FILM FEST 2019

For its 10th anniversary in 2019, the annual Loft Film Fest continued its tradition of bringing the world of cinema to Tucson with an extraordinary line-up of films, guests and special events at The Loft Cinema, while also looking to the future by adding cutting-edge Virtual Reality programming to the Fest for the very first time!

EXCEPTIONAL PROGRAMMING

The eight-day cinematic showcase of exclusive Tucson screenings, running November 7 – November 14, 2019, featured award-winning festival favorites from Berlin, Cannes, Sundance and more; lively Q&A's with internationally-acclaimed industry professionals; provocative discussions; exciting retrospective screenings; Southwest, Arizona and Tucson Premieres; Academy Award-winning films; fearless late night programming and captivating short films. In total, this year's Loft Film Fest presented 47 narrative features, documentaries, short film programs and special events.



FESTIVAL STATISTICS & HIGHLIGHTS

- Nearly 8,000 people attended the 10th annual Loft Film Fest, both at The Loft Cinema and at On the Road outdoor locations!
- A total of 47 narrative films, documentaries, short film programs and special events were presented!
- Opening night of The Loft Film Fest rolled out the Oscar red carpet with the sold-out Tucson theatrical premiere of Fernando Meirelles' comedy/drama, *The Two Popes*, which went on to receive three Academy Award nominations, including Best Actor for Jonathan Pryce and Best Supporting Actor for Anthony Hopkins!

- Closing night of the Loft Film Fest was one for the history books, as a sold-out crowd was treated to the Tucson theatrical premiere of the highly anticipated thriller, *Parasite*, which went on to win four Academy Awards, making Bong Joon Ho the first Korean filmmaker to win the Best Director Academy Award, and the film itself the first non-English language Best Picture Oscar winner!
- Loft Film Fest titles were selected from top festivals around the world, including Berlin, Cannes, Chicago, Hot Docs, Telluride, New York, Sundance, South by Southwest, Toronto, Tribeca, Venice and more!
- Loft Film Fest presented 21 Arizona Premieres, 12 Tucson Premieres and 4 Southwest Premieres, as well as 5 Official 2020 International Film Academy Award Submissions (from South Korea, Mexico, Senegal, Sweden and Bulgaria), two Academy Award winners (*Parasite* and *American Factory*), one Cannes Film Festival Palme d'Or winner (*Parasite*), one Cannes Film Festival Grand Jury Prize winner (*Atlantics*), one Best First Feature Ariel Award winner (*The Chambermaid*) and one Sundance Film Festival Best Director Award winner (Julie Reichert and Steve Bognar, *American Factory*)!
- 24 special guests were in attendance, including actors, directors, producers, screenwriters, film critics and other industry professionals!
- Loft Film Fest hosted four Tributes and Award Presentations for **Illeana Douglas** (*Grace of My Heart*), 2019 Lofty Achievement Award; **Edward James Olmos** (*Selena*), 2019 Lofty Achievement Award; **Don Coscarelli** (*Phantasm*), 2019 Lee Marvin Maverick Award; and 2020 Oscar winners **Julie Reichert and Steven Bognar** (*American Factory*), 2019 Social Justice Award presented by Kirby Dick!
- One CICAE Art Cinema Award (selected by an esteemed panel of international jurors), was presented to the Israeli narrative feature, *Advocate*.
- One unique, immersive Virtual Reality experience was offered the Tucson Premiere of the Emmy-nominated short film, *Traveling While Black*, presented to audiences in a vintage bus provided by Old Pueblo Trolley.











The Loft Film Fest went on temporary hiatus in 2020, due to the Coronavirus pandemic. In its place, The Loft Cinema presented the first-ever **Loft Short Film Fest**, a 5-day film festival, running November 18 – November 22, 2020, featuring a curated selection of acclaimed, award-wining new short films from festivals around the world, in programs ranging from Live Action and Documentary to Animation and Late Night! The Loft Short Film Fest was presented both theatrically and virtually, with all short film programs premiering live at the Loft Cinema's outdoor exhibition space, Open Air Cinema, followed by an exclusive, limited-time online release the following day. Cash prizes were awarded to Audience Favorites in each program category.

LOFT KIDS FEST

The 13th annual Loft Kids Fest provided free films and fun activities for **4,712** children of all ages in July 2019!

This unique ten-day film fiesta featuring 14 free screenings, free popcorn, educational activities, games, prizes and surprises, has become a much-loved summertime tradition for families in Tucson and Southern Arizona.

Each day of the Loft Kids Fest offers a different film, from beloved classics and foreign discoveries to popular contemporary favorites, and every film is a show, with interactive pre-screening fun hosted by community partners including Mildred & Dildred Toy Store, Friends of the Pima County Library, Tucson Village Farm, Reid Park Zoo and more!

The 2019 Loft Kids Fest film program represented 11 countries: China, Czech Republic, Japan, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Poland, Russia, South Africa, Sweden, UK and USA.

In July, 2020, our 14th annual Loft Kids Fest went Virtual with **The Loft Kids Fest at Home**, featuring ten days of great family-friendly movies that viewers could stream for free! Each day's film was preceded by an international animated short that could also be streamed for free, along with a unique pre-taped Kids Fest bonus video featuring an original film introduction, a fun crafting-at-home demonstration, raffles and surprises, created by The Loft Cinema staff and some of our dedicated community partners!

The response to this new (and temporary) Virtual format for the Loft Kids Fest was overwhelmingly positive, generating such viewer comments as:

LOFT SOLAR CINEMA 2019

In 2019, Loft Solar Cinema continued to expand its reach and engage new audiences, increasing the total number of people served from just over 5,000 the previous year to a record number of over 8,000! Audiences across Southern Arizona enjoyed a total of 35 family-friendly films screened under the stars, and participated in moderated discussions at many of these screenings. Loft Solar Cinema is a traveling cinema program, taking films to underserved rural communities and urban neighborhoods throughout Arizona with the use of a cargo van outfitted with solar panels and batteries to power a 20' inflatable screen and state-of-the-art projection and sound system. By partnering with local stakeholders, Solar Cinema is curated to reflect the specific interests of each community.

From a screening of the gripping Indigenous activist documentary *Warrior* Women on the San Xavier District of the Tohono O'odham Nation, to an outdoor Science on Screen presentation of the sci-fi classic 2001: A Space Odyssey at Spacefest, featuring a pre-film discussion with star Gary Lockwood and a panel of NASA astronauts, to a Loft Kids Fest kickoff party at Himmel Park, where over 1,000 children and their families enjoyed a hilarious collection of vintage *Looney Tunes* cartoons, Loft Solar Cinema is carefully programmed to connect with a wide range of different communities, and to provide a memorable cinematic experience for all who attend.

With funding from Desert Diamond Casinos and Entertainment and a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts, Loft Film Fest On the Road takes festival-quality films to venues throughout Arizona. In 2019, LFF on the Road hosted 15 film events, partnered with 16 community organizations, and featured screenings of recent film festival hits *The Guardians, Warrior* Women, Inventing Tomorrow, and Awake: A Dream from Standing Rock, along with a screening of the 1998 Sundance Film Festival award-winner, Smoke Signals.














FINANCIAL DATA

The Loft Cinema experienced phenomenal growth since transitioning to a nonprofit arts organization in 2002. That growth was on a trajectory to continue in 2020 until the pandemic forced the cinema to close for the first time in its 48-year history.


As the data shows, several revenue streams dropped sharply in 2020. This deficit was offset by an increase in fundraising revenue and a drastic reduction in expenses.




