In his diabolical new thriller, Park Chan-wook crafts a dark fable about the cutthroat nature of contemporary work culture and the domestic desperation for material comfort. In a fine tightrope-walk of a performance, Lee Byung-hun brings humor and likability to the tricky role of Man-soo, a middle-aged husband and father who has been laid off from the paper manufacturing company to which he has devoted decades of his life. After an extended and increasingly worrisome period of unemployment, Man-soo begins to take merciless measures toward solidifying his standing with a potential new employer, leading to wild—and ever more absurd—acts of violence, crafted by Park in his inimitable and extravagant pitch-black comic style. Adapted from the Donald E. Westlake novel *The Ax*, updated for our precarious moment in time, Park's *No Other Choice* is enthralling all the way to its brilliant bitter pill of an ending.

Screening and Conversation with Director Steven Jenkins

Spanning decades and musical styles, this far-ranging one-hour program of short films and videos from the Bob Dylan Archive features rare and previously unreleased clips of Dylan on stage and in the studio. Selections include early acoustic versions of "Blowin' in the Wind" and "Girl from the North Country," an intense rendition of "Isis" from the Rolling Thunder Review, with Dylan in face paint; a delicate performance of "Simple Twist of Fate" featuring Scarlet Rivera on violin; The Band backing a swaggering run-through of "Baby Let Me Follow You Down;" a cover of Woody Guthrie's "Vigilante Man" with Ry Cooder and Van Dyke Parks; a glimpse into the Archive's film restoration project with never-before-seen footage of "It's All Over Now, Baby Blue" from 1966; and many more treasures.

Bob Dylan Center Director Steven Jenkins will present the films and engage in a post-screening discussion and audience Q&A.

The Bob Dylan Center opened in Tulsa, OK in May 2022 as the permanent home of the Bob Dylan Archive. The mission of the Center is to inspire and celebrate fearless creativity by exploring the music and artistry of the Nobel Prize-winning singer-songwriter as a catalyst for personal expression and cultural change.

The Donn of Tiki is a documentary film about Donn Beach, also known as Don the Beachcomber, creator of the Tiki bar. But his story goes much deeper than that. He was an American maverick, constantly creating his own opportunities, reinventing himself many times over, and was well known for embellishing the details of his extraordinary life.

This film takes on the task of separating fact from exaggeration to finally tell his story. There are slivers of truth to his tales – a youth spent in Jamaica, running rum during prohibition, hunting down cigars and liquor for troops in World War II, and bringing the first commercial lu'au to Hawai'i.

Interviews from historians, scholars of Indigenous Politics, as well as the Tiki community, paint a complicated portrait of an optimistic man from Texas, who became a champion for authenticity, both in his work, and within himself.




